A Fond Farewell

As the U15 Boys head to high school in the fall, Head Coach Mark Kennedy reflects on the last six years:

What has been your favorite memory with this team?

Having been with many of the players since they were eight years old, my greatest memory is their growth. I am a vocal coach, as the boys would probably attest to, and I remember the first game in Portland, CT and being hoarse at the end of it after guiding them through the game.

Keeping track of seven new players and helping them learn the game took a lot of instruction. Another memory of the team was in our final fall

season we made it to the second round in the CT Cup and

unfortunately lost to Farmington. Seeing the boys at the end of the game emotionally invested in winning was fulfilling. They wanted to win. They expected to win and they were willing to show their disappointment at the end of the game and I am proud of them for that.

What do you see as their greatest strengths?

This team's strengths are willingness to work hard,

players willing to step up and lead each other and they are a true team. Over the course of the six seasons, there was only once that there was an issue with teammates not getting along. They are truly friends and that makes them powerful as a group.
